Sanctioning: Northern Blast 2010 is a non-qualifying competition, sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating. This competition will be conducted according to the Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook for the 2010 competitive season, except as modified in this announcement.

Eligibility: Eligible competitors are current members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating. Skaters may compete at their current test level, or at one level higher, as of March 13, 2010. However, a competitor may not skate more than one level in a given event.

Skaters may compete in *either* the Competitive Test Track *or* the Well-Balanced Free Skate events, *but not both*. Competitive Test Track skaters may also compete in Compulsory Moves, Spins & Jumps at the same level.

Judging: Short Program and Free Skate events for Juvenile and above will be judged using the International Judging System (IJS). All other events, including Open Juvenile and Competitive Test Track Free Skate, will use the 6.0 system.

Facility: All events will be held at the Seven Bridges Ice Arena, 6690 South Route 53, Woodridge, IL (a Chicago suburb). Phone: 630-271-4400. Maps and directions are included in this announcement. This facility has 2 ice surfaces: 200' x 100' and 200' x 85'.

Entrants: Space is limited, so please mail early. The referee and/or Northern Ice Skating Club reserve the right to limit entries in an event and/or cancel an event based on time restrictions. No refunds will be issued after the closing date, per Rule 3235, except if an event is cancelled. Check the accuracy of the entry form before submitting it. *No level or event changes will be allowed once the applications have been submitted to the referee.*

A minimum of 2 entries is required to schedule an event. Compulsory Moves, Spins and Jumps events may be ladies and men combined, although we will try to run men only events whenever possible.

Fees: Fees must be paid in full before a skater will be allowed to compete.

- \$110 First IJS Event (Juvenile - Senior)

Competition Schedule: A tentative schedule will be available approximately 10 days prior to the competition on our website at www.northernice.org and will be e-mailed to all competitors who provide a valid and legible e-mail address. Refer to the web page for changes. However, all times are approximate. Be sure to check with Registration upon arrival at the competition for exact times. No schedules will be mailed via regular mail!

Registration: The Registration desk will open 1 hour before the first event of the day, through the end of each day's competition. Skaters must check in at least 1 hour prior to their event. Skaters should check in also with the ice monitor and be prepared to skate up to 45 minutes prior to scheduled times.

Music: Competitors should bring 2 CDs in good condition. Skaters must deliver their music when they check in at Registration. Reclaim music at Registration after the event in which it was used. Unclaimed music will not be mailed.

Practice Ice: Practice ice may be available at various times during the competition, as the schedule permits. Practice ice availability and reservation/payment procedures will be posted on our website at www.northernice.org after the competition schedule is available. Music will not be played on practice sessions.

Additional practice ice may be available at Seven Bridges Ice Arena the week of the competition. Contact Seven Bridges Ice Arena at 630-271-4400 for details.

Official Merchandise: Northern Blast 2009 apparel and other skating related merchandise will be available for purchase at the competition.

Awards: Awards will be given following the posting of results in each group:

Limited Beginner – All skaters.

All other levels – 1st through 4th place.

Depending on the number of competitors and time available, final rounds may be offered at the Pre-Juvenile through Senior levels. Final rounds will be based on free skate only.

Kirk Langseth Rising Star Award will be awarded to the Intermediate Ladies Free Skate Champion, in memory of our beloved coach and mentor Kirk Langseth.

Accommodations: The official hotel is the Lisle Hyatt, 1400 Corporetum Drive, Lisle, IL. It is approximately 3 miles directly north of Seven Bridges on Route 53. Event Details

Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile events will be divided into groups by birth date. All IJS events (Juvenile level and above SP and FS events) will be divided into groups by random draw.

Note the descriptions for all Limited Beginner and Beginner events. They changed from previous years, so be sure to enter your skater in the appropriate level events/

Competitors in IJS events (Short Program and Free Skating) *must* enter their Planned Program Content Sheets (PPCS) online at www.usfsa.org by May 1, 2010. We will not accept any PPCS on paper or at Registration.

Juvenile skaters must be under 13 years, as of March 13, 2010. Open Juvenile skaters are 13 years or older, as of March 13, 2010.

Well Balanced Free Skate

Free skating events will be skated on full ice. Programs should conform to the Well-Balanced Free Skate Programs, as per U.S. Figure Skating 2009-2010 Rulebook.

Depending on the number of competitors and time available, a final round may be offered at the Pre-Juvenile through Senior levels. Final rounds will be based on free skate only.

Test Track 2009-10 (effective September 1, 2009)

Skaters may enter EITHER the new test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but **NOT** both during the same non-qualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music permitted. The 6.0 judging system will be used for all Test Track events.

Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

Compulsory Moves

Compulsory Moves will be skated without music. Most Compulsory Moves events will be on 1/2 ice surface, however, Juvenile, Open Juvenile, and Adult Silver/Gold will be on full ice.

Combination jumps may not include any turn or change of foot between jumps. Repeated or added elements and excessive footwork will be penalized. Compulsory moves must be skated exactly as stated, but may be skated in any order. Juvenile and Open Juvenile events may be combined, depending on numbers of entries.

Artistic Impression

Music may be vocal. Skater must interpret theme and temperament. Judging will emphasize interpretation and originality. Costumes are encouraged to enhance mood of music. Props allowed. Event will be divided by age where appropriate.

Duration is shown as a range, to accommodate those skaters with music for National Showcase.

Jumps

Jump events will be skated without music. Jumps must be performed in the order listed. Juvenile and Open Juvenile may be combined depending on number of entries.

Each skater will be allowed 2 attempts at each jump and will be judged on the best attempt. Jumps will be skated in sequence, making consecutive attempts at each jump. Where there is a choice of jumps, the skater must do the same jump for the second attempt.

Beginner through Pre-Juvenile and all Adult events will be held on 1/2-ice. Remaining events will be held on full ice.

Spins

All events will be skated on 1/2 ice. Spins shall be skated in a simple program with limited number of connecting steps. Repeated or added elements and excessive footwork will be penalized. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but in any order.

Juvenile and Open Juvenile may be combined depending on number of entries.
